MACH was founded in 1994 and is recognized by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. MACH serves the following 11 counties: Aiken, Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, Calhoun, Chester, Fairfield, Kershaw, Lancaster, Lexington, Newberry, Orangeburg, Richland and York.

MACH, a non-profit corporation, is comprised of over 60 agencies and led by a Board of Directors to fulfill a single purpose to end homelessness by making a difference in the lives of people who are experiencing homelessness. MACH addresses this cause by promoting collaboration and planning among state and local governments, corporate and nonprofit organizations and faith-based entities that support individuals and families in their quest to move from homelessness to housing.

Members of MACH provide a wide range of housing and supportive services to include: emergency and transitional shelter, permanent housing, clothing, food, meals, employment and training, transportation, legal services, rent and utility assistance, counseling for various addictions, case management, dental care, medical care and childcare.

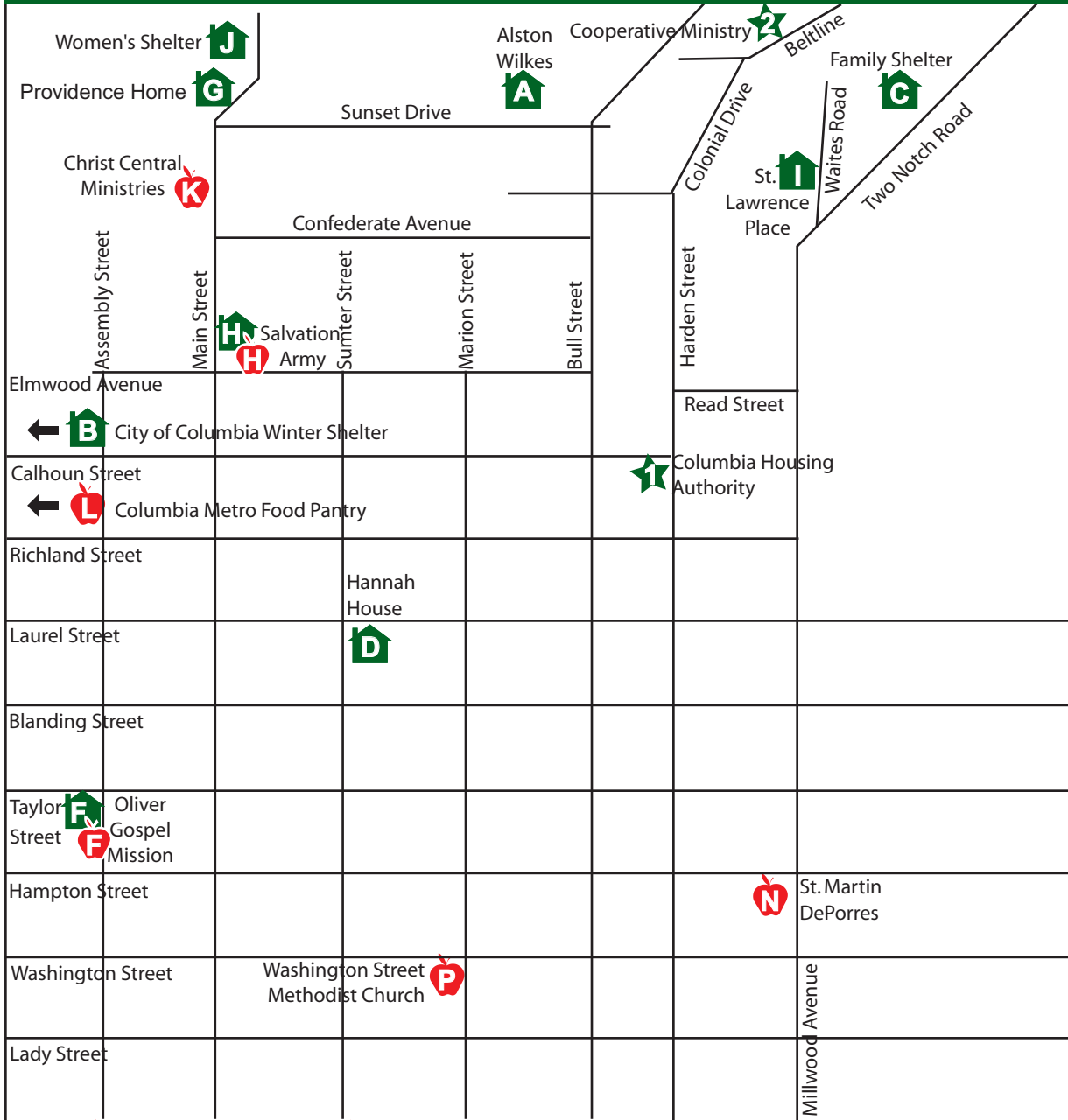
